SACRAMENTS

Baptism:

All arrangements, including confirmation of the date, must be made with the parish office.

Sponsors must provide proof of eligibility by a letter from their respective pastors, must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Communion and Confirmation. Sponsors, if married, must either be married in the Church or with the Church's permission. Parents must attend Baptismal Preparation, which is regularly scheduled throughout the year.

Marriage:

Arrangements must be made directly with the pastor at least 6 months before the date of the wedding. Marriage preparation is required and couples are asked to speak to the priest first before setting a date. Couples, rather than parents, should contact the priest. If either party was previously married, an annulment must be granted prior to the selection of a future wedding date.

From the desk of Fr. John.



Dear Parishioners,

For almost ten years my religious superiors appointed me to work at a summer-time-only "house of prayer" in Somerset County where we made time to slow down, to enjoy things like the beauty of the earth and sky and forests, or the friendship of one another, or personal and common prayer that became rich and insightful. We cut grass and shrubs and trees; we cooked meals that we ate unhurriedly; we swam in refreshing cool mountain spring water that filled an antique pool; before concluding each day with compline ("now, O Lord, you let your servant go in peace because I have seen your salvation...."), we pitched horse shoes or rolled Bocci balls on our rough lawn. In that summer-time pace, I and my fellow brothers and priests felt invigorated so that even the words taken for granted in our busy times, held new meaning.

In the middle of July when you and I come to weekend Mass, together we read the recollections of disciples about that time when Jesus walked and talked with people all over Galilee and on the way to or from Jerusalem. The recorded accounts tell us a few interesting aspects of Jesus' traveling ministry:

- that Jesus set out deliberately to encounter people;
- that Jesus wished to meet those who felt or described themselves as being alienated from religion or from God;
- that Jesus impressed people as knowing God and God's ways – they said that he spoke with authority;
- that Jesus presented a deeper, fuller way of living the core of what Moses taught;
- that Jesus helped physically hurting people and restored them to health;
- that Jesus expressed charity to all, even to people who were not Jewish;
- that Jesus presented a new way of living God's desires for the world;
- that Jesus forgave people who had truly sinned against God;
- that Jesus bothered, annoyed, and disturbed some other leaders.

The same accounts tell us that thousands of persons heard about Jesus and traveled to find him, not just for the physical healings he could work, but also because his words opened them to a deeper understanding of God's ways with us.

In the middle of July while you and I aren't at a House of Prayer free of many distractions, we may permit ourselves to relax a little more than we ordinarily do. This time might allow us to know the Jesus whom the apostles, the disciples, the crowds, the religious leaders, and even the Romans once met and couldn't ignore. Since our time is limited, let's enjoy and make use of it well. Jesus loves to have his friends around him.
