

The Quality of Mercy in Three Days



and places beyond our sight, people just like us call out for an outpouring of mercy. "Lord, have mercy," or in Greek, Kyrie elision. In a contemporary Christian-rock form of this ancient plea to God, the all-powerful one, Ted Kim and Cindy Reithmeier sing touchingly about a "forgiving God forgiving us," repeating the three-fold appeal: Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy; Lord, have mercy on us. Some of us recall similar songs or at least similar moments when we approached God in prayer to request a share in Mercy.

Requests voiced this way in common speech may implore God's strong assistance with difficult persons or situations. Fr. John Flalder, an American priest ministering adult education in Australia for more than fifty years teaches that "the word 'mercy' comes from the Latin misericordia, which in turn comes from the two words miseria, meaning wretchedness, misery or affliction, and cor, meaning heart. Thus etymologically mercy means a heart for the wretchedness or affliction of another. Or, as we understand it in English, it means compassion or pity."

Father also notes that St Thomas Aguinas comments in his Summa Theologiae: "To say that a person is merciful is like saying that he is sorrowful at heart (miserum cor), that is, he is afflicted with sorrow by the misery of another as though it were his own. Hence it follows that he endeavors to dispel the misery of the other person as if it were his own; and this is the effect of mercy. God cannot feel sorrow over the misery of others, but it does most properly belong to him to dispel that misery, whatever form that shortcoming or deprivation takes" (STh I, g. 21, a. 3).

The misery of heart or of soul that one or several may experience should strike us as exacting a toll on us. Our parish, like any other, has some people deeply afflicted by sorrow, whether resulting from accumulated sufferings or from awaking to a nightmare of deadly proportions. It's hardly a truism to say that what one suffers in a Christian community, all suffer, for we sense well the pain of our sisters and brothers.

So, yes, in our parishes our peers may deeply desire the Living God to meet them and dispel their sorrows. Please see that over three days, our parish will address the desire of God to heal our brokenness in four distinct ways: 1. [Tuesday] Through an invitation to lay our burden down in the wondrous Sacrament of Reconciliation wherein Christ touches our wounds, forgives us for our part in inflicting burdens on one another, and heals us; 2. [Wednesday] Through God's powerful and peaceful Presence to us in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist wherein God stays close to those most hurting or afflicted. We will sit with the Lord as friends visiting one another and we will beseech the Lord Jesus to act upon with deep healing, especially in our familiar prayers and in the intercession of two saints renowned for being instruments of healing, Blessed Solanus Casey and St. Pio (Padre). Remains of their holy ways of life have become occasions for God's working among us. 3. [Thursday] Through a common celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, a way Jesus left us to meet him in our distress and to be touched by the healing hands of God our Father.

There's yet another reason we will keep these holy days early in August and it comes from St. Francis of Assisi who pleaded with God and then with the Holy Father that all who seek deep release from sin and its aftereffects might find it in a commemoration of a blessing Francis first experienced in a tiny dilapidated chapel dedicated to Our Lady of the Angels. Once a year from sunset on August 1 through sunset on August 2 thousands of people flock to Franciscan Churches and Chapel to receive a sure promise of freedom even from the enduring effects of deadly sins. It's termed the Portiuncula Indulgence. Francis had a heart of mercy.

Without out seminarians, Kevin and Craig, this mini-mission (resembling 40 Hours) would not have been even planned. They will be touched by the faith of Assumption Parish in St. Louis and in St. Francis. Let us support them in their endeavors toward priestly ministry.
