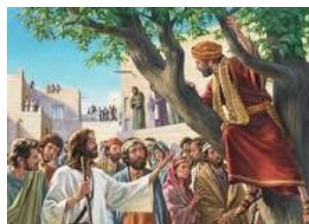

Dear Parishioners,

On **October 18, 19, & 20**, all the priests and deacons assigned to work in this four-county region of west-central Pennsylvania met at **Christ Our Shepherd Center** in Greensburg. Those of us who have long memories, know that the second Bishop of the Diocese, William Connare, had the Center built as St. Joseph Hall so that it might serve as a preparatory “seminary”/school for young guys of high school age who might consider studying to become a priest for the Diocese. At that time in the 1960s every diocese had some program for men in this age bracket so that they might find support for a “priestly-vocation.” Young men who joined in their high school years were called “lifers” since many of them began to take seriously the concept of priestly life and service when they were hardly yet comfortable with preparation for earning a living, or succeeding in a career, or even dating. While time was ultimately unfavorable to this total concept of a preparatory program for guys for ministry, *St. Joseph's Hall* became the *Bishop Connare Center* and eventually the *Christ Our Shepherd Center*, **as a place for religious, spiritual, and human formation of priests and of laity.**

Today the **Center seems to have become a place where good continuing education and formation, theological, pastoral, and spiritually, can and does take place.** So, all the priests assembled at the Center and listened as they **addressed issues important to the future of the Church in west-central Pennsylvania.** This brief “encounter” seemed to **ride the waves of the Synod Process** in which we meet each other, listen, discuss, and plan for our future. This year, the priests, at the urging of Diocesan Priests' Council, discussed the consequences of a vision that Bishop Brandt had about how to make the Diocese a stronger center of faith, **because we broke out of ourselves to welcome priests from the Philippines to minister among us and to us.** **Twenty plus priests** have **accepted the invitation** to be among us. Looking at our data available to all of us, and seeing the real persons serving us, we all accept that our brother priests from the only church in Asia really strong in organization, administration, devotion, and ritual and in pastoral practice, have given us a better way of **handling our diminishment than was modeled in many other dioceses.** **The men who came to us are amazing well-prepared and fully devoted to the Lord and to Jesus' Mission.**

A few parishioners in places throughout the Diocese **may complain about the heavy accents** of some of our brother priests, but **other parishioners advise us to be patient and humble in order to gain understanding.** Priests also heard witnesses to how **effectively our brother priests** from the far east have **encountered, engaged, and ministered to our laity.** We are not bereft of assistance because the large and vibrant Church in the Philippines **accepts a call from Jesus to live in mission.** Foreign Mission for these men means a service here and a relationship that looks first into the eyes of the one with you and only later confirms our unity of faith. How blessed our parish has been to have seen this model up close and personal. **I do not find it offensive** to hear that we have become recipients of God's good grace because of the generosity of some who **admit that we need them.**

Finally, please ponder how we might **entice our youth** to accept a **vocation to serve Jesus** and us again in a religious vocation. Do you see a **grandchild who shows promise of good? Plant a seed.** Ask him about the priesthood or about becoming a friar or a monk. Or ask a daughter if she can see herself being a great sister to others in the world? **Just ask.**

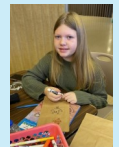
