

Dear Parishioners,

Connecting with the Sacrifice of Christ

People who visit St. Anthony Chapel in Pittsburgh on Troy Hill do so to view the collection of relics of the saints held to be the largest collection outside of western Europe, but hardly anyone visiting that chapel comes away unimpressed by the hand carved, life-sized, true to form Stations of the Cross. It seems that the original small chapel holding relics had to be expanded to receive these Stations.



While a standard devotional practice prayed communally during Lent on Fridays and Wednesdays, religious shrines to which pilgrimages are made frequently provide devotees the opportunity to pray this meditation any day of the year. As a novice, my novice master instructed us to pray the Stations of the Cross at least once a week on Fridays and to walk the Stations every day in Lent. Instructors taught us to employ various prepared booklets or to compose our own meditations as we walked this devotion.

In our Catholic parish we have prayed the Stations on Friday evenings, beginning at 7:30, after having a period devoted to Eucharistic Adoration beginning at 6 PM. This year we will add Stations at midday, at noon, in the Coral church so that those unable to come out at night might not be deprived of this tradition. In our Catholic life, if every Sunday recalls Easter Sunday and the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from Death, every Friday remembers the brutal passion and death of Jesus. So, the Stations of the Cross recall **fourteen separate events** or Jesus' obedient actions on our behalf. Scholars say that since St. Helena looked for and identified the sites in Jerusalem along the way where Jesus carried the Cross to the Place of the Skull (Golgotha), she walked the Way of the Cross and prayed that Way..

Because our faith is Incarnational, that is, the events of our Redemption happened in real time, in real spaces, St. Helena, scholars hold, walked in imitation of Jesus the path that Jesus trod through the streets of Jerusalem. Pilgrims who came to Jerusalem believing that Jesus is the Christ, sought to pray where these events of salvation happened, so they walked through the narrow streets and identified fourteen major points in which Jesus acted for us. Originally, pilgrims praying along the way of these streets may have known as many as eighteen sites. In parishes and shrines in Europe, preachers popularized the way of reflecting on the total sufferings of Jesus as a free act of his will to bring us back to the Father. The Franciscans who were chosen and granted care and supervision of the Holy Sites, wanted their congregations and members to live as followers who would practice Jesus' admonition to take up the Cross and follow Jesus day-by-day. These preachers would seek to enliven faith, and processions with Crosses in tow.

Well, what about us at Assumption Parish? We have three beautiful sets of the icons which commemorate these events on the last day of Jesus' human life: a traditional cast and painted form in the St. Francis Church in Coral; a glass/ceramic, mosaic form on the Church walls in St. Louis in Lucernemines; and, a small and simple-in-design cast metal form along the driveway in Lucernemines. Occasionally I will see a parishioner walking along the driveway to meditate on the Suffering and Death and Burial of Jesus.

If you haven't kept this devotion for some time, I invite you to return to these simple enacted prayers and reflection that work to keep us focused on the saving Work of Jesus for us. Can you be Simon of Cyrene? Or Veronica? Or among the women weeping? Or the Roman centurion who acclaimed that "this was the son of God." During Lent let's allow our faith to be more vivid and moving for us.
