Dear Parishioners,

Does your family tell stories about yourselves that somehow describe the "personality" of your family? A recent article in a Catholic periodical speaks about our **common stories that build a bond within the Catholic faith**. The author contends that we may be missing out on a direct way of sharing faith that touched many in the past. Funny the coincidences, but I also

remember that especially in the lazy spring afternoons, teachers in our Catholic parochial elementary school read stories to us of brave, bold, courageous, and holy people. Those stories were comforting and challenging.

I can still picture **St. Tarciscius**, that twelve-year-old acolyte who volunteered in 275 to carry Holy Communion to prisoners when adults could not safely do so. A Roman emperor, Valerian, hated Christians and took every opportunity to end their beliefs and practices. **This youth, a mere kid, died rather than give up the Holy Eucharist for ridicule or abuse.**Catholic Sisters teaching us told us about Tarcisius to encourage us to be devout in receiving Holy Communion and to be proud of our Catholic Faith.

Teachers also read to us accounts of the **bravery of the Jesuits** who came to the wilds of eastern North America in 1640 to share Christ with the native peoples. Bravery best describes the patient endurance and determination of these men in rejection and physical hardships and torture. Reading from these accounts **exposed young persons to martyrdom for faith in Christ Jesus in contemporary New York state and Ontario, Canada.** No, the lingering wounds and loss of digits would not stop these evangelizers and priests. Close by this witness, we read about St. Kateri Tekakwitha in another account of missionary success as a 24-year-old woman accepted Christ and traveled over 200 miles to find refuge in Montreal where she could practice her Catholic faith.

We also heard inspired stories about **St. Therese "Little Flower,"** a young French girl who became determined to live a holy life, a person who wanted in every way to be a saint. Teachers told us about **her "Little Way" of spirituality** that became a great way for sanctification within the grasp of any person. They told us, too, how she serves as a **patroness of Missions even though she never left France**.

The Sisters also read about **St. Charles Borromeo** who showed great promise as a youth and quickly rose to positions of responsibility in a church in need of reform. As they told the story, he excelled because he manifested a living relationship with Christ. In their narrative, God worked with **Charles to make of him a servant**.

Thinking about these "stories," I see some common threads: youthfulness touched by God for holiness; determination that living in Christ is a satisfying way to be a Catholic follower of Jesus; and, sufferings point people to immersion in God's good will for them and for the world.

Can you recall any favorite accounts that inspired you when you were younger? If we fail to read these commons stories now, we are missing out on an opportunity for future growth.



EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES OF THE WORLD EXHIBIT

Friday, June 9th through Sunday, June 11th

This exhibit, to be displayed in Podowski Hall at our Lucernemines worship site, is a physical presentation of the Eucharistic Miracles website created by Blessed Carlo Acutis. Carlo Acutis was an Italian Catholic youth and website designer, who is best known for documenting Eucharistic Miracles around the world and cataloguing them onto a website which he created before his death in 2006 from leukemia at the age of 15. He was noted for his cheerfulness, computer skills, and deep devotion to the Eucharist which became a core theme of his life. Carlo Acutis was beatified on October 10th, 2020, and is currently being considered for canonization. This Exhibit is accompanied by a first class relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis. Admission is free. Resources will be available for children and teens. Plan to stop by and learn more about the Eucharistic
