

MEET OUR SEMINARIANS!

Hello!

My name is Tyler Randolph and I am so excited to be here at Our Lady of the Assumption Parish for the summer! Just in these first two weeks I have met so many parishioners and have had such great experiences already!

I just completed my first year of formation at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Philadelphia, and this coming school year I will be in my second year of Pre-Theology. I grew up Presbyterian near Uniontown and I converted to Catholicism while a student at Seton Hill University. I

graduated in 2013 with my Bachelor of Music degree in Sacred Music and Organ as well a Bachelor of Arts in Religious Studies/Theology. After my time at Seton Hill, I completed my Master of Music degree in Sacred Music and Organ at Duquesne University.

I have served as a parish music director and organist in the Diocese of Greensburg for over a decade, most recently for 8 years at Immaculate Conception Parish in Irwin, where I had come into the Church. During that time, I also taught middle school religion at Queen of Angels Catholic School in North Huntingdon.

In my spare time I enjoy playing the organ, thrift shopping, going for walks and bicycle rides, boating with my friends, and playing board games.

I am looking forward to experiencing parish life here at Our Lady of the Assumption this summer working with Mario and Father John. You have such a strong and vibrant parish and I am so happy to be a part of it!



"I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." Galatians 2:20

During my very first theology class in seminary I was introduced to the Scripture verse above, which although I had read prior to this particular exposure, it hit me different in this case. It caused me to come face to face with who I am as a seminarian and who I was before surrendering my full will to the Lord when the world seemed to be such a vast and powerful place to contend with.

When I was approximately eight years of age, I felt the call to

the priesthood for the first time. As I got older the world became louder and as that happened the voice of the Lord became more difficult for me to hear. I never got into any serious trouble growing up and I did well in school and had friends who were good people—but *good* and *holy* can be different things and I now realize that the world presented me with what was *good* and, for a period, it successfully distracted me from what was *holy*.

I became a very successful chef and cooked at the number one city club in America. I wrote cookbooks, was featured on TV shows, hosted my own radio show, and built a media business that could have comfortably sustained my lifestyle and a family into the future. All of this I desired, and it was all good, but I realized that while I had some level of happiness I was still restless. As St. Augustine so profoundly wrote, "Our hearts are restless, until they can find rest in you" and I found that to be radically true.

I wrestled with God as I discerned where he was leading me. I prayed and I struggled with having to let go of everything that I worked so hard to achieve. I finally realized that I had to fully trust in God to enter into where he was leading me. The Lord was patient and I am grateful that he never gave up on me and that he continues to reveal his love to each one of us in a more profound way each day. The more we open ourselves up to him the more he reveals to us.

And that is what brings me to this lovely community of Our Lady of the Assumption here in beautiful Indiana County. I believe the Lord has brought us—Father John, Tyler, myself, and this community of believers—together for these 10 weeks to open our hearts even more to his love and to guide us deeper into relationship with him. The things we will do together this summer are things that we cannot do apart and they are things that God desires for us through his infinite love and care for his us, his sons and daughters in Christ.

I look forward to spending time with each of you, to getting to know you, and to worshipping Almighty God together as a family in Our Lord Jesus!


Summer Series: Eucharistic Adoration for Children! SAVE THE DATES!
