



Hearts Afire

Did your grandparents display religious art in the home? An older or earlier generation thought it important to display a crucifix or depictions of the Virgin Mary or of St. Anthony or of St. Therese Little Flower. Often, judging from what I

spied on house blessings or in administering the "Last Rites," Catholics of a former generation hung prominently a picture of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and another of the Immaculate Heart of Mary above their beds, along with a crucifix. In an era when you never went to sleep with offering a prayer in thanksgiving for the last 24 hours, perhaps the simple depictions of the loving heart of Christ and of the pleading heart of Mary assisted in maintaining a daily life-focus.

The mental images of our ancestors mumbling quiet prayers to the Lord to whom they owed their lives retains their vividness. Why did they and their generation retain a devotion to the hearts of Jesus and of Mary? Did the devotion find an impetus from the wars that wrecked European civilization and called into question the role of Christianity in Western Europe and the Americas? Before the First World War, a Polish congregation erected one of the most prominently located churches in Pittsburgh, high on Polish Hill overlooking the city, dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

One professor at the University of Notre Dame writes that "Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus **focuses on God's immense love for humanity**, even though it was repulsed, scorned, and crucified. Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary points us towards her love for Jesus and for God as an example." Prayers associated with these hearts often speak of hearts broken by being ignored, or deliberately repulsed, and the prayers humbly ask forgiveness and pardon of God the Father who sent Jesus among us through and in the body of Mary. Even our devotion to the Eucharist reveals something beautiful and wonderful about the Love of God for us willing to sacrifice everything to bring us home.

That same university writer contextualizes the **devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary within the fundamental, ancient faith of the Church** by writing that "Though it found prominence in the 20th century, devotion [even] to Mary's Immaculate Heart is not new. Early Christians revered the movements of Mary's heart in the Gospels—she pondered the events of the nativity in her heart (Lk 2:19); and when she and Joseph presented Jesus in the temple, Simeon prophesied that a sword of sorrow would pierce her heart (Lk 2:35). Of course, Mary was faithful to Jesus to the end, and the image of her sorrowfully beholding her Son on the cross has always struck a deep chord with the faithful." Seems that our ancestors in faith heard the same deep chord and joined the hymn honoring God's work to find us and draw us to himself.

Devotion to Mary's heart was taken up by theologians and saints from many ages, but it was the 17th century French preacher, St. John Eudes, who formalized this devotion into liturgical practice that we observe today. John's spirituality focused on the love of Jesus and Mary, symbolized in their sacred hearts. He began a feast day for parishes in France to encourage people to honor the heart of Mary and the Sacred Heart of Jesus; these feast days spread quickly and were taken up around the Church.

The feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus will be observed on Friday, June 16, this year followed immediately by the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Saturday, June 17.

We might dedicate our own prayers for those who have fallen away from explicit closeness to God to the enduring Love symbolized by the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES OF THE WORLD EXHIBIT

This exhibit, to be displayed in Podowski Hall at our Lucernemines worship site, is a physical presentation of the Eucharistic Miracles website created by Blessed Carlo Acutis. Carlo Acutis was an Italian Catholic youth and website designer, who is best known for documenting Eucharistic Miracles around the world and cataloguing them onto a website which he created before his death in 2006 from leukemia at the age of 15. He was noted for his cheerfulness, computer skills, and deep devotion to the Eucharist which became a core theme of his life. Carlo Acutis was beatified on October 10th, 2020, and is currently being considered for canonization. This Exhibit is accompanied by a first class relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis. Admission is free. Resources will be available for children and teens. Plan to stop by and learn more about the Eucharistic Miracles our Lord has worked in the world!


