What would you do if your phone rang or began to vibrate, but instead of a familiar family member or friend showing up on your caller ID, the name of God appeared? Seriously, if God was calling you would you answer?

Our phones demand our attention in so many different ways and most of us get that pleasant feeling of a dopamine release when someone we enjoy talking to calls or texts us. But what do we do when God reaches out?

Prayer is a response. Much like when we answer our phones when someone we love calls, when we pray we are answering God. God always goes first and we can't exist, breathe, or even pray without him. We are conditioned to believe that when we pray it is really ourselves who are doing something—we are talking the initiative. But in reality, our initiative when it comes to prayer is in the form of a response to God who calls us into communion with him first and then we answer him by entering into prayer.

In the midst of our busy and often chaotic lives, it is easy to lose sight of the importance of prayer. Yet, we must keep in mind that prayer is not merely some religious duty but rather it is a transformative practice that can profoundly impact our daily lives. It is in prayer that we create and foster a personal relationship with the Lord which is the very basis of our faith. In prayer we also find comfort in times of stress, and seek guidance in navigating the complexities of daily life. Today, I would like to invite you to reflect upon the significance of a regular prayer life as together we explore ways to overcome excuses that hinder us from embracing this transformative practice.

By regularly engaging in prayer, we open ourselves up to the possibility of experiencing profound moments of clarity and a deep sense of purpose—that can only come from God himself. As nice as this sounds however, excuses always seem to be present in our human condition, tempting us to neglect our time with the Lord. For many reasons, we all find ourselves saying things like, "I'm too busy," "I don't know how to pray," or "God doesn't listen to me." We know these excuses are not based in reality and that they are not coming from the Lord. In fact, these excuses tend to originate when we turn in and focus on ourselves and all of the "things we have to do" or all of the "things we want" instead of looking toward God and asking for his help and guidance with the challenges we are actively facing. In any case, let's dismantle these barriers and explore five simple yet effective strategies to cultivate a faithful prayer life:

Prioritize Time: In the hustle and bustle of our routines, it is crucial to carve out dedicated time for prayer. Treat it as an appointment on your calendar with God, honoring the real personal relationship with him in your life.

Embrace Simplicity: Prayer doesn't require grand gestures or eloquent words. It is a deeply personal and intimate conversation with our Lord. Speak from the heart, expressing your joys, sorrows, and desires in genuine simplicity.

Seek Guidance: Prayer can often be messy, as our lives are often messy. God does not ask us to hide this from him, in fact just the opposite—he wants us to reveal our full selves to him and invite him to sit in the mess with us. The Psalms are a perfect example of this, whenever times are difficult or you just can't seem to find the words, turn to the Psalms where God provides the words and examples of prayer for us. Sacred Scripture, The Divine Office, Mass, and the other Sacraments are great places to look when we feel we need a little guidance in how to open ourselves up to God.

Find Moments of Stillness: Amidst the chaos of daily life, seek moments of stillness and solitude. Whether it's a quiet corner in your home, a serene park, or even during a peaceful walk, these moments provide an opportunity for prayerful reflection. A dedicated comfortable prayer space is also a great way to anchor consistency and to help us go from the business of everyday life to the calmness of spending time with the Lord.

Adapt to Life's Seasons: Recognize that prayer may evolve over time. Embrace the ebb and flow of your relationship with God, understanding that your prayer life may change in different seasons of life.

Remember, prayer is not an isolated event but a continual conversation that shapes and transforms us. Through prayer, we cultivate a sense of peace, resilience, and purpose, enabling us to face life's challenges with grace and clarity.

As we embark on this journey towards a more faithful prayer life, let us cast aside excuses and embrace the extraordinary power that lies within ordinary moments. May our prayers become a source of strength, inspiration, and connection, leading us towards a deeper understanding of ourselves, others, and most importantly God.
