#### "Take the Time to Be Holy"

I would like you to think for a moment about your daily routine... Tally up all the various times throughout the day you do a certain activity such as turning on the TV, checking email, checking up on Facebook, etcetera. I'm guessing that you might be surprised at the number that you come up with! We each have habitual things that we do throughout our day that have become such an

engrained part of us that we do it almost automatically or subconsciously. **Now, imagine doing the same thing with prayer!** What if, throughout the day, it was as easy to pray throughout the day as it is to pick up the phone and check emails for 5 minutes at a time, 5 times per day?

Well, we're all in luck! In my last article, I mentioned "liturgy" - the public prayer of the Church - and its two forms, the Mass and the Liturgy of the Hours. The **Liturgy of the Hours** is this "tool" to pray throughout the day. It is a way to sanctify the entire day, deliberately stopping for a few minutes to set time aside for another thing... we do it for so many lesser things, so why not for prayer? Just as praying the Mass unites us to the universal Church, so does praying the Liturgy of the Hours.

The Liturgy of the Hours (also called the Divine Office) has a long and rich history in the Church. It consists mainly of the praying of the Psalms, the treasure of our Jewish heritage which links us to ancient Israel. Those in religious communities would recite the psalms throughout the day so they might sanctify the entire day to God's glory. Today, priests, deacons, and consecrated religious are obliged to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, but it is not just for the monks in the monastery and the nuns in the nunnery! It is the **prayer of the Church**, so it is intended for <u>all</u>!

The Liturgy of the Hours can be prayed communally - such as the example of religious communities, groups of the lay faithful coming together, or special celebrations of the Liturgy of the Hours that take place in parish communities. For myself, the Liturgy of the Hours has become such a staple of my prayer life and I truly love the many varieties of ways there are to pray it! Throughout my time in seminary, many of my favorite moments have been praying the Liturgy of the Hours – whether it is simple spoken communal Morning Prayer on a weekday, an elaborate Solemn Vespers (Evening Prayer) on a Sunday, Night Prayer with a few of my friends late at night, or praying the Office of Readings by myself in the chapel or on the couch! *Whether prayed by oneself or in community, remember that it is the prayer of the universal Church, and that you are never praying it alone!* 

If you would be interested in learning more about the Liturgy of the Hours, there are so many resources available online (such as the 'official' guide, the *General Instruction on the Liturgy of the Hours*) and numerous books available.

To pray the Liturgy of the Hours, there are two wonderful (and free!) apps available – iBreviary and Divine Office. These give the exact texts of the Liturgy of the Hours right at your fingertips! A good introductory print version is "Christian Prayer" which doesn't include all of the Hours, but is a good start before delving into the complete 4 volume set, called "The Liturgy of the Hours."

In the next article, I will go into more detail explaining the various "Hours" and their components. *As a "spoiler" of things to come...* we will be celebrating Evening Prayer as a parish community each evening as a part of our Eucharistic 40 Hours event August 8-10!
