Dear Parishioners,

3 Years and Counting

For a full three years now, I have been privileged to serve Our Lady of the Assumption Parish here in Indiana County. At the time we Capuchins arrived here in the summer of the waning Covid-19 "shutdown," I first saw this parish as two beautiful churches in search of their beautiful congregation. Catholics still had permission then to watch Mass on television or on some live-stream service in place of in-person participation. Pew were roped off, relegating those attending to every second row, all were asked to mask against spreading or breathing in

germs. I first learned the parishioners by their eyes.

As you may recall, I announced that I came here for a few reasons: a. To allow me to be part of the team of Capuchins assigned to assist the bishop in caring for parishes in this county. B. To serve a parish in need of a full-time pastor again, after having been assigned to another priest serving full time elsewhere with assistance of a Pilipino priest. C.) To accept that my will role increase in the time I am with you. Finally, D.) the Location of the office in Coral allowed me to visit my father in nursing care in Monroeville.

At that time, the weekend schedule for OLOTA for me seemed to be remarkably lean: confessions and Mass on Saturday, leaving me free of responsibilities after 5 PM, and after the 8 AM Mass on Sunday morning. **Something didn't feel right about that schedule**, even if it allowed me to devote more time to care for my father.

However, this style of pastoral care, struck me, as a priest as far too little, since I was accustomed throughout many years of priestly service to celebrate at least two Masses on a Sunday morning and to assist congregations with additional needs. In late summer, I met with the Parochial and Finance councils to hear advice and to consider options: the members of the councils thought that we ought to reach out to our parishioners by providing more services that might attract people back from the enforced curtailment. At that point the numbers attending were relatively small – recall that we only sat in every second row and maintained distance from anyone wanting to share a pew.

Each time the Diocese asked us to describe how we were serving our members in the time of crisis, I noted that we needed to provide some additional real service. We also noted how low were the weekly collections/contributions to the support of the Church. So, we doubled the weekend Masses to permit people to worship again in Masses with social distancing. Little-by-little, we sought other services we might offer, including "Live-Streaming" of one Mass each Sunday. As a Pastor I firmly believe in doing those things that build up the Body of Christ.

Remembering how we began and endured the post-Covid shutdown, brings us to October 2023, when very shortly the **Diocese will instruct us to be very careful to take the traditional** "October Count."

If you follow the bulletin weekly, then you know that **each Sunday we include the count of parishioners per Mass**. The count **does not reveal why** one Saturday evening at 6 we attract 65, and on another evening attract only 40. In the bulletin, we have sought to offer a summary of the weekly "Offertory collection" separated from the list of varied causes to which we contribute. **Only the Offertory amount tells us how much we have contributed to the ordinary operation of the parish** and thus these monies pay our operational expenses.

Permit me to conclude these reflections for now by **comparing the numbers attending** with **the amount offered for operations**, at least **over the last quarter of the year**. I believe that the attendance shows that people still seek God in Jesus Christ, and that they want God's guidance, and that people have responded with enthusiasm to the additional programs we offer. Of the churches represented in the Homer City Ministerium, **even on our worst weekend**, we **attract more persons to worship God** than any other house of worship represented in the Ministerium. A bottom line here is that we need a certain amount of **regular income** to meet our expenses, and that **amount is well beyond \$ 5,000**.

I will share more on this in coming weeks.
