### One Super Sunday, Feasting and Fasting

As far as I recollect, in creating our parish calendar for February 2024, we avoided scheduling any events for Sunday evening, February 11, even though western Pennsylvanians have less invested in *The Game* this year than we have had in past games. Although our "regional"



champions" squeezed into a play-off game this year, we all guessed that their season-long stumbling's would prevent them from rising to the level of champions who have entertained and enthralled us for many years. Oh, they will come back to rivet our attention once again, the attention of both fair-weather fans and of fans who bleed black and gold.

In fifty-eight years, American football has created a **new national holiday**, "Super-Bowl Sunday," and we like this post-Christmas Season winter holiday. Congress need not declare this holiday; this one arises from the devout, faithful fans who are happy to find some wild celebration, exuberance unbridled, before the solemnity of Lent takes hold and the remainder of winter plays out, regardless of what Phil, the Groundhog, declared.

When in college/university I studied ancient Latin culture, literature, language, and Roman history, and I learned that the Romans looked for holidays that rescued them from the daily drudgery of ancient life. One professor pointed out to us that almost very month the Roman culture provided the ordinary citizen with "bread and circus," or some holiday to keep them satisfied or relieve them of their labors. Truth be told, don't we bear a similar longing?

This weekend here at Mass we pray the scriptures and orations of the *Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time*, the counting of our Sunday worship that began with the conclusion of the Christmas Season on Epiphany/The Baptism of the Lord on January 7/8. Before *Ash Wednesday* on the 14<sup>th</sup>, Americans will keep *Mardi Gras*, or as the term translates, *Fat Tuesday*, not because we want to admit how large we have become, but because when Christians in western Europe fasted with keener intent than now, they wished to use up the meat fats that they ordinarily consumed in both festive and in ordinary times. Our society may be oblivious to the real intention of the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, but that parties abound.

Because Ash Wednesday coincides with *St. Valentine Day* and we have developed that Saint's feast day as one devoted to romance, red-heart-shaped candy boxes will provide a special temptation not to give up sweets at least for the first day of Lent and will urge such love as to honor one's wife or fiancé with special tokens to demonstrate affection and care.

I'd like to propose that we take seriously the invitation to "do penance" in the annual season that our Catholic Community of Faith adopts as a preparation for remembering and renewing our personal and communal commitment to Christ. Yes, you have once committed yourself to Jesus as the One Christ, both personally and communally. Christ Jesus is your personal and communal Savior. Fasting affirms our commitment to Jesus, the Christ, or the Messiah, who Saves our immortal souls. May I suggest that in your prayers this week you directly ask Jesus, who loves you dearly, how you might fast in penance for yourself, for your family and friends, and for those who have rejected the Love of the Father? May I also suggest that we intend to abstain from meats at least on Fridays in Lent? Jesus taught the disciples that some works on ministry need fasting and prayer.

Everywhere these days health professionals have discovered the benefits of "intermittent fasting," saying that evidence shows that however we fast, in *alternate day fasting*, or in *5:2 fasting*, or in *daily time-restrictive fasting*, we may gain better health in as many as eight ways, such as, maintaining our blood sugar, or contributing to weight loss, or to improvements with cognitive or memory retention, with reducing inflammation, and so on.

Above all, for us, fast and abstinence will help us to know the Lord and to contribute to a witness to him whom others attack and ridicule. Please choose to do penance this Lent. The world cries out for Lent.
