

More about how we pray....

If you have watched episodes of *The Chosen*, the latest filmed rendition of the ministry and life of Jesus, have **you found some segments surprisingly touching** in what they show us of and about Jesus in as historically accurate manner? The



producers and directors of the film have done their homework well, and so present to us social and religious contexts for the stories that the Gospels portray. Perhaps its just that our biblical scholarship, cumulative studies, and digging through old ruins have come **together to fill in the blanks within our New Testament copies**.

Oh, the same producers and directors take some liberties with the text and draw out connections for the sake a good story line here and there, after all the "genre," or the way the story is told, must in the end still be termed "historical fiction." The "fiction" added to the New Testament in this case seems quite credible and helpful to us who want to understand yet more about **Jesus as a living person who brought the Father's love for humanity front and center.** For example, the producers and directors developed personalities for Mary of Magdala, for Peter's wife, for friends Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. I believe that the development of these personalities obliges us to re-imagine how Jesus met us and what Jesus' personality showed us about God. And, don' forget the New Testament is historical, too.

In this context, I find the many scenes in the stories when **Jesus easily slips into prayer** to be instructive. For example, after exhausting himself with too many healings and meetings to count, Jesus returns to the camp where he and the apostles demonstrate that they have surrendered all to follow this way [think of the instructions: "nowhere to lay one's head," "take nothing for the journey," "you will be like lambs in the midst of wolves."]; before Jesus beds down for the night, he prays to the Father in simple Jewish formulae **that bless God as the Creator of all life and the Origin of all good.** After meeting so many who suffered so much, Jesus has not lost awareness of the Supreme Goodness that is God, his Father, nor even of the goodness of God operating in the suffering person. Watch Jesus meet illness and pain, then see him seek to restore some to a world before the fruit of the Tree made us much less like God and much more like people lost, lonely, and afraid. **Contrast Jesus' ways** with those of even our **contemporary atheists who find no source of Good** and who **discover Evil everywhere**, thus pronouncing "No God."

Dr. Brant Pitre, a man who has schooled himself in the ways of Jewish Life in the first century, says that as the disciples and apostles asked Jesus to teach them to pray, they learned and prayed the "Our Father" so well that the prayer quickly became "central in Christianity. By the first century, it was customary for Christians to pray the Our Father 'three times a day' (as it is reported in the Didache 8:3), as well at Baptisms and the Eucharist."

Pitre says we pass over the prayer too quickly and miss how **Jesus taught us to focus on God in the first three petitions:** (1) Our Father who art in heaven *hallowed be thy name*. (2) Thy *kingdom come*. (3) *Thy will be done* on earth as it is in heaven. The **first** petition, Pitre teaches, is a prayer for the whole world to stop taking God's name in vain and to begin treating it as sacred, while the **second** petition teaches disciples to pray for God's eternal kingdom to come down to earth, thus a prayer for the final advent of "eternal life." The **third** petition prays for the salvation of the world as we ask, "Thy will be done." In Matthew 7:21, **Jesus says we only come to him because we do the Father's will**, not because we say "Lord, Lord."

The final **four petitions focus on human beings**, on us. See the key words: *Give us; Forgive us; Lead us; Deliver us.* More about these petitions another time.
