Dear Parishioners,

Holy Doors in a Jubilee Year

**On Sunday, November 10, our parish will invoke the Lord's Blessing on the new doors on our church in Coral.**

You know too well, as I do, too, the sad story of the difficulties encountered in replacing the original doors on the 1937 church dedicated to St. Francis. It seemed to me that hardly a day passed in my first three years as pastor here when the doors installed just a few years before I arrived here were not a matter of comment or conversation or critique. I, too, could see their deterioration and so I consulted about how they were so quickly looking weathered, with portions of the surface separating from the core and wooden portions looking much older than those so recently constructed and installed. Last year portions of the weather stripping at the bottom of the front doors fell off, revealing a rotting core. A talented handyman, thinking he might stop the loss, worked only an hour or so before refusing to do any more since the surface of the doors were not salvageable. In short, we were back at square one.

In fairness to the contractor chosen to provide these door which failed, he believed that he could provide a suitable and stately product.

If you haven't been to the Coral church yet to see the new doors now fully installed, including the double door to the old basement hall, you owe it to yourself to see the beautiful new entry into the St. Francis Church. Thanks are due to our parishioner, Mr. Chris Arone, for leading us to discover a manufacturer who builds solid doors to exacting specifications and building codes. Chris labored immeasurably to take the most careful measurements. These doors are constructed for commercial grade buildings and need minimal maintenance. Thank you, Chris!

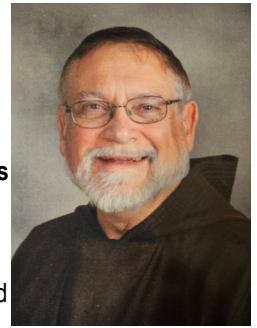
But we also must thank the property oversight team for the Diocese, Jim Garvin and Tony De Stefano, who repeatedly worked with me and our councils to assure that we could gain insurance monies to replace the failed doors. Attorneys were also involved both locally and at the Diocese. Thank to all and to the Lord for leading us to resolution. **Early November becomes a good time to bless our doors because we can connect these doors to the new Jubilee Year.**

On December 24, Christmas Eve, the Church begins the observance of another Jubilee Year. Jubilee Years welcome pilgrims and offer them blessings, as pilgrims visit the "Holy Doors" to be opened in welcome in Rome. Ahead of the upcoming Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, Pope Francis, in his *Bull of Indiction*, entitled '*Spes non confundit*' ('Hope does not disappoint'), indicated as the Holy Door "of St. Peter's Basilica and the other three Papal Basilicas, namely St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls, with the exception of the Holy Father's expressed desire to personally open a Holy Door in a prison 'to offer prisoners a concrete sign of closeness'."

The text about the Jubilee Year 2025 also took the opportunity to recall that "the peculiar and **identifying sign of the Jubilee Year, as handed down since the first Jubilee of the year 1300**, is the indulgence that 'intends to express the fullness of God's forgiveness which knows no bounds,' through the Sacrament of Penance and signs of charity and hope." **The Holy Door in St. Peter's welcomes us into the mercy of Christ where we find the full forgiveness of God** and thus may be reconciled to the Lord and to one another. While we cannot go to Rome, **we can see in our own church doors a welcome from God to enter a place where mercy may be found.**

So, **Sunday, November 10, right after the 9 AM Mass** we will process out the doors and bless them as solemnly as the Lord allows. Then, please stay for fellowship or Coffee & Donuts.
