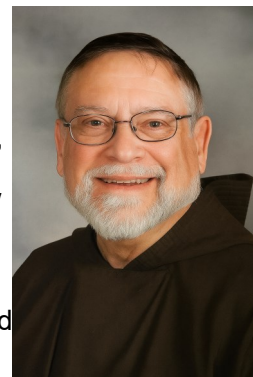

WELCOME BACK TO PATHWAYS!!!

Dear Parishioners,

While another winter's storm potentially threatens us with more snowflakes, ice accumulations, and deep-freeze temperatures, I am preparing to spend a few days in the desert southwest with a fellow priest. **Friends for fifty years**, we hope to enjoy one another's company and give thanks for our friendship and our mutual call to ministry. If all works out as planned, I will return in time for the next set of weekend Masses.



Fifty years seems to be nothing relative to the **two-hundred and fifty years** that our nation celebrates in **2026**. All that happens these past weeks and months, demonstrates that the various ideas and values expressed in **1776** still resonate today and still force the dialogue that makes a nation of *e pluribus*.

Next to eight-hundred- years, two-hundred and fifty years seem to be nothing at all. Lots of significant activity brought about good things for the world. **Eight-hundred years ago, God worked with a young man in central Italy**, in what's named "the green heart of Italy," where that young man heard the voice of God speak to him in an abandoned church inviting him to devote his youthfulness to reimagining how people relate to one another and to God, the Lord of all creation. **Francis of Assisi** lived 800 years ago.

1226. Major **events of 1226** included King Louis VIII's **Albigensian Crusade** in the south of France where **an ascetical group of people who called themselves "good men" worked to disestablish the sacramental priesthood in Christianity**, thus calling into question God's choice in Jesus to offer the Bread of Life and to invite men to ministry of Spirit and Life.

The Pope called upon religious communities to preach counter to these men who were attempting to **refashion Christianity according to a non-apostolic model. St. Dominic**, a man also called to a real and deep relationship to God and who accepted apostolic preaching as a necessary mission for this age, had **died in 1221**, five years prior. Young King Louis IX ascended to the French throne, leading to his mother's regency. In this same eventful year, Francis of Assisi died.

Pope Leo has invited us as a church to commemorate the death of St. Francis of Assisi as a way of revisiting the witness St. Francis offered and still offers. Leo terms **Francis' way as "still timely and effective" as the way often leads to holiness.** "St. Francis of Assisi—born into wealth but remembered for his radical embrace of poverty, humility, and peace – was praised in the papal decree as 'a sun born into the world' in an age marked by conflict, moral laxity, and religious misunderstanding. His example, the decree notes, remains **strikingly relevant in a modern era similarly troubled by social division, violence, and spiritual indifference.**" Leo asks that Christians imitate Francis' simplicity and charity, leading to "zeal and fervor of active charity."

Amazing that we worship at two churches dedicated to saints, St. Louis and St. Francis, so associated with the world of 800 hundred years ago. Let's invoke them to help to revive our charity and establish our hope in 2026.






